

Since 2010, Inclusive Kids has proudly given back a remarkable **\$1,485,881.22** back into our local community to support children and young people facing disadvantage, hardship and vulnerability. Through the generous support of individuals, businesses and community partnerships, these funds have made a direct and lasting difference across a wide range of essential programs and services.



(Back to School Program)

\$333,362

The largest share of funds has gone toward helping children return to school equipped and confident. Through this program, thousands of students have received uniforms, stationery, books and backpacks, giving every child the chance to learn, grow and thrive alongside their peers.

### **COMMUNITY SUPPORT**

\$272,249

Funding has helped create inclusive spaces and community initiatives that empower families, build resilience and foster a sense of belonging. From grassroots programs to targeted family interventions this investment supports a stronger, more connected community.

### DISABILITY

\$177,889

Children and young people living with a disability have been supported through access to programs, mobility equipment, tailored education services and inclusion opportunities—ensuring every child has a voice and a place.

### KIDS IN CARE

\$190,000

We've proudly supported children and young people in out-of-home care with access to experiences, essential items and wraparound supports that help build selfworth, identity and hope.

### HOUSING ASSISTANCE

\$119,156

Providing safe, stable and supported housing solutions for vulnerable young people has been a critical investment. These funds have helped prevent homelessness and promote independence.

### **FOOD PROGRAM**

\$72,000

Nutritious meals fuel learning and development. These funds have supported school-based food initiatives and the IFYS community kitchens (Urban Angels Community Kitchen) ensuring no child goes to school hungry.

# COMMUNICATION & EDUCATIONAL DEVICES

\$129,444

Digital inclusion matters. These funds helped children gain access to laptops, tablets and communication aids, bridging the digital divide for education and connection.

# MEDICAL & MENTAL HEALTH CARE

\$51,677

Early intervention and access to mental health care have been critical in supporting the wellbeing of children and young people. This funding ensures kids get help when they need it most.

### **FAMILY SUPPORT**

\$111,110

Families facing crisis have been supported through emergency relief, casework and wraparound services, keeping children safe and families together.

### RESPITE

\$15,000

Funds have allowed for respite services for carers and families, providing crucial relief and reducing stress in high-demand care environments.

### **INDEPENDENCE**

\$13,993

These funds helped young people transition to independence through life skills development, employment support and mentoring opportunities.





# Sunshine Coast Lightning Strikes with Heart for Kids Doing it Tough



n a powerful show of community spirit, players and staff from Sunshine Coast Lightning took time out of their busy training schedules recently to support the Fuel for School Program, rolling up their sleeves to pack fruit alongside the team at Inclusive Kids.

In a world where sport is often defined by wins and losses, today's efforts reminded us all that true champions are measured by the difference they make off the court. With bright smiles and even brighter hearts, the Lightning team packed hundreds of bags of fruit destined for Sunshine Coast schoolkids who turn up to school each day without anything in their lunchboxes.

The Fuel for School Program, an initiative of Inclusive Kids, provides vital food support to children across the region who face food insecurity, a silent but deeply felt issue in many local communities. With the help of volunteers and supporters like Sunshine Coast Lightning, the program is able to ensure kids have access to healthy snacks, allowing them to concentrate, learn and thrive in the classroom.

The Lightning players didn't just turn up, they leaned in. From sorting dried apples to chatting with the volunteers, their care and compassion were clear in every action. It was more than a photo opportunity; it was an act of genuine kindness and a reflection of a team culture built on giving back.

Head Coach, Belinda Reynolds, spoke warmly about the importance of community connection, 'We're more than just a team on the court. We live here, we play here, and it's our responsibility to give back to the people who support us. No child should ever have to go without food and if we can help even a little bit, then we're proud to do so.'

Players echoed that sentiment, with Captain, Steph Fretwell, adding, 'It's heartbreaking to think that kids in our own community go hungry. Helping to pack fruit today felt like a small gesture, but we know it makes a big difference.'

According to Inclusive Kids, it sure does. The Fuel for School Program has grown exponentially in the last two years, responding to an increasing demand from local schools. What began as a modest initiative is now supporting hundreds of children each week, and every piece of fruit packed today means one more child has a better chance to learn and grow.

Supporting Inclusive Kids through the Guinness World Record attempts — the 24 Hour Mow, Hoops for Hope, and Catch for Kids, has been one of the most rewarding experiences I've been part of. Each of these events combined a sense of fun and challenge with a deeply important purpose: raising funds to support children and young people on the Sunshine Coast who, through no fault of their own, face disadvantage.

I was drawn to Inclusive Kids because their mission is tangible, local and immediate. They're not just talking about making a difference they're doing it, right here in our own community. Whether it's providing food for a child who would otherwise go without lunch, supporting educational opportunities, or giving kids the chance to take part in sport and community life, their work has a direct impact.



For Inclusive Kids the 24 Hour Mow was a perfect example of endurance and community spirit, turning an ordinary act into something extraordinary. Hoops for Hope brought people together in a fun, high-energy environment, showing that even a basketball can be a tool for change and Catch for Kids was pure spectacle, an event that captured imaginations and drew attention to the cause in a truly memorable way. Catching an NFL ball travelling at 100 KMPH thrown from a helicopter is no mean feat but Steve Hirst successfully caught it and broke a world record in the process.

Supporting these events wasn't just about breaking records — it was about breaking cycles. Every dollar raised goes towards giving kids the same opportunities many of us take for granted. I believe that when we invest in our children, we invest in the future of our community.

Inclusive Kids has shown that creativity, determination and compassion can inspire people to rally around a cause. I'm proud to have played a part in their journey and will continue to stand beside them in their mission to ensure no child is left behind.

Alex Rotary Helps Turn Vision into Reality for Inclusive Kids' Fuel for School Program



When it comes to making a tangible difference in the lives of children, the Alex Rotary Club has shown what community spirit can achieve. Through the funds raised at their much-loved Winter Solstice Swim, the club has played a pivotal role in helping Inclusive Kids operationalise its Fuel for School program.

Fuel for School ensures that children who arrive at school without lunch are provided with healthy snacks giving them the energy and focus they need to learn. Thanks to Alex Rotary's support, the program was able to establish dedicated packing facilities and create a fully functioning system to deliver food directly to schools across the Sunshine Coast.

Club member John Malloy said the cause resonated deeply with members. 'We know that a child can't



concentrate or reach their potential if they're hungry. For us, the Winter Solstice Swim was more than just a fun event—it was a way to make sure no child starts the school day without the basics.'

The funds raised went beyond providing food. They enabled the setup of an efficient packing room, equipped with refrigeration, storage and preparation space, allowing volunteers to pack hundreds of snack items each week.

'Seeing the Fuel for School program move from concept to reality was incredibly rewarding,' John added. 'It's proof that when the community comes together, real change happens.'

Inclusive Kids panel praised the Rotary Club's contribution as 'the crucial kick-start' that made it possible to move from idea to action, noting that the partnership has had an immediate and ongoing impact on children's wellbeing and educational engagement.

The partnership between Alex Rotary and Inclusive Kids is a shining example of how local fundraising can create lasting change, one lunchbox at a time.
